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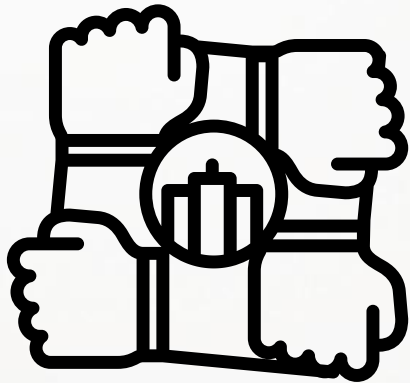
Introduction

Communicating with stakeholders about its achievements and activities

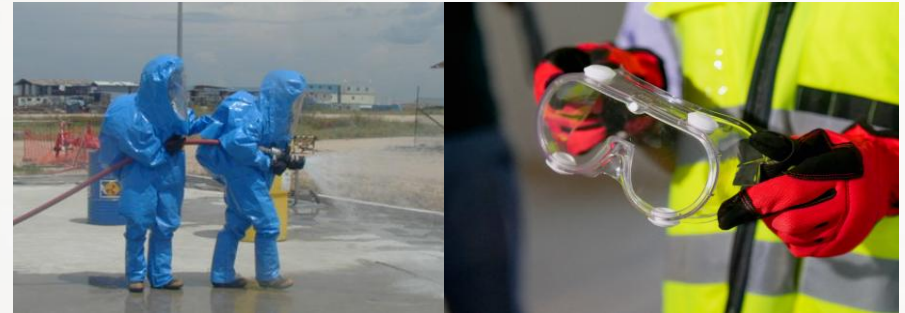


WHAT IS RESPONSIBLE CARE

Responsible Care was launched in 1985 by Canadian Chemical Producer Association (CCPA). It is a global, voluntary initiative developed autonomously by the chemical industry for the chemical industry.

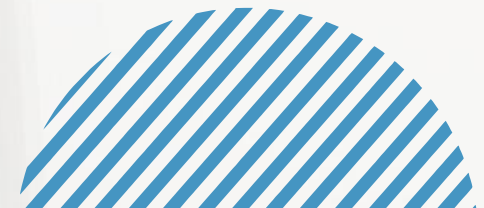
The seven codes are as follow :

1. Community Awareness and Emergency Response Code
2. Distribution Code
3. Employee Health and Safety Code
4. Pollution Prevention Code
5. Process Safety Code
6. Product Stewardship Code
7. Security Code

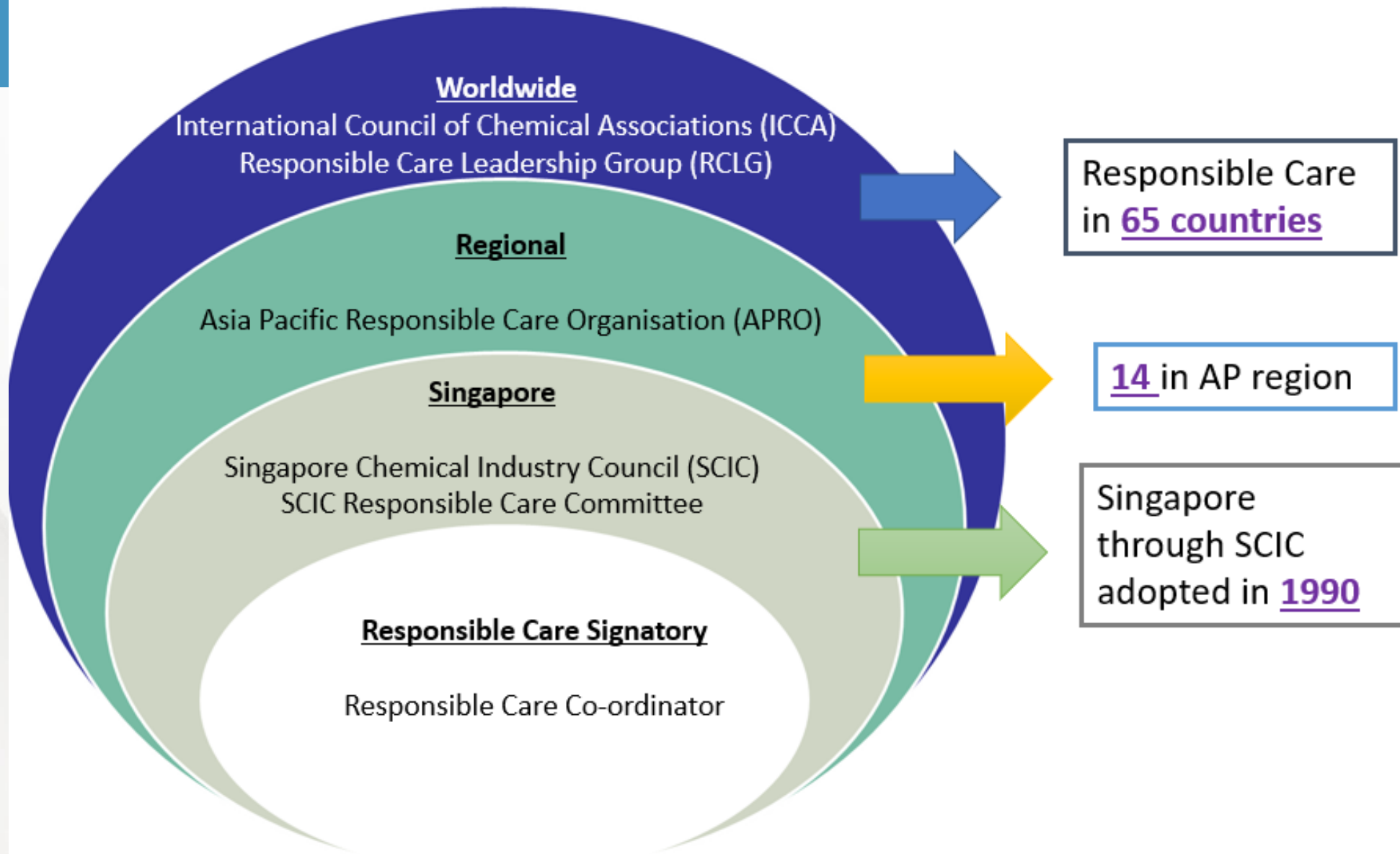


Core Principles

- Continuous Improvement in safety and environmental performance / There is no ceiling for safety, etc.

68 SCIC members are active Responsible Care signatories

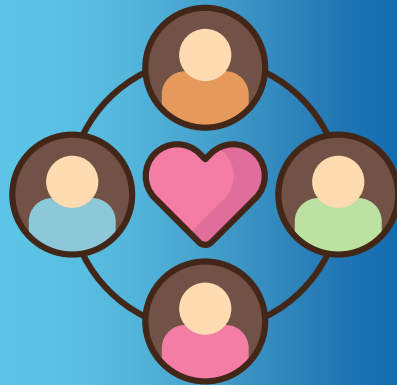
